6.1 Budget Approval for Graduation Party 2023 [Proposed by J. Z.]

The budget is calculated based on last year's cost breakdown. It is budgeted at \$4,300 for the event costs.

6.2 Proposal for SUPRA to get Formal tickets at St Pauls formal dinner 15.05.2023 [Proposed by E. M.]

We can buy up to 10 tickets for the formal dinner at St Pauls 15.05.2023, for \$25 dollars a head.

The tickets can be given away by lottery to SUPRA members, and advertised in grad-post as well as on social media.

We think this is a great way to give the postgrad community an opportunity to experience college life if they do not live in college.

E. M. explained it's going to be a trial run at this stage and could allow more students to come if interest goes.

M.C. raised concern regarding the methods of receiving the tickets and suggested the potential of having the formal dinner at other colleges other than St Pauls.

The motion will be modified with more considerations and brought to upcoming meetings.

★ 6.3 Proposal for one year trial of SUPRA Carer Officer

Carers are a significant but under-represented group within the post-graduate community at USyd. Their needs have traditionally been considered by the Women's Officer and the Disabilities Officer**, but many carers do not fall within either role's remit. To genuinely consider the needs of carers and to represent their voice, we are proposing the introduction of a trial of a Carers Officer to investigate the needs of post-graduate carers at USyd.

The aim of this role is to identify the needs and priority of students with carer responsibilities on campus. Carer's include people with caring responsibilities for children, older members of the community, and people with disability/disabled people, chronic illness, or other people who need ongoing assistance.

The main aim of this trial is to investigate the needs of carers at USyd and how SUPRA can support and advocate for postgraduate carers. The Carers Officer will work in collaboration with post-graduate carers, the university, and SUPRA officers and networks to establish the needs of carers. As part of this the Carers Officer will also establish a social platform for USyd carers to meet and connect. At the end of the trial, the Carers Officer will produce a report compiling the experience and wisdom gained from the year to present to Council, with a focus on how SUPRA can better represent carers, as well as recommendations for moving forward.

The role should be given a stipend for 14 working hours of work per fortnight, equivalent to the equity officer roles. This role should be assigned by council to a suitable candidate, with lived experiences as a carer.
