Emergencies

- Dial triple zero (000) for emergency services (fire/ambulance/police). Calling the police is the quickest way to get help in an emergency.
- Call Protective Services on 02 9351 3333 or 1800 SYD HLP (1800 793 457). Protective Services are available 24 hours a day to assist with an emergency or safety threat and are certified to perform first aid. Protective Services are also located in libraries across the University and have a 24-hour presence in Fisher Library.

Getting around campus safely

Free shuttle bus

Safety escorts

University Protective Services can provide safety escorts to students who feel unsafe on campus 24 hours a day. You can call Protective Services on 02 9351 3333 to request an escort to your car, bus stop, etc.
